TDs are the <u>liaison</u> between the USEF, competition management, judges and the competitor.


We are the USEF's representative to the competition: their eyes and ears.


The competitors' needs.

One of our paramount duties is to safeguard the welfare of the horse.

- We are circulating around the show grounds watching the warm-ups, competition arenas, and stabling areas to monitor that the horses are being treated well and are safe.
- We are watching for abuse, harsh riding, over-riding, distress, blood, whip marks, etc.

We assist management to help ensure that every effort is made to provide for a safe competition.

- We inspect the competition and warm-up arenas, as well as the stabling areas and grounds.
- We work to identify potential safety issues and bring them to the attention of competition management.




We are knowledgeable in how a competition should run.

6-10 are all <u>colors that are not bright</u>. They are legal.






